VICTORY CONDITIONS

The North Koreans win if they control a path of contiguous road hexes from the west board edge to the east board edge free of unbroken/surrendered Marine units and no American unit has an LOS to the road within their regular weapon range.

SPECIAL SCENARIO RULES

1. Spotting Conditions are Average.
2. The Koreans have access to a 122mm battery, low ammo
3. The Marines have access to a 105mm battery, high ammo.
4. The Americans have one elite tank commander.
5. Use CCF counters to represent Korean infantry and weapons. Use Soviet counters to represent Korean AFVs.
6. One Marine 118 NCO starts the scenario marked courageous.
7. The Creek is deep, treat as a shallow River, ie. Wading is possible.
8. The North Koreans have 5 smoke grenades.
